# Cresswind Community Fund Second Quarterly Meeting June 22, 2022, 3:00 pm

#### **Minutes**

The meeting was called to order at 3:00 by president Bill Papciak. Bill thanked the Planning and Events Committee led by Susie Holbrook and Elaine Wood along with many volunteers for all the work done in preparation for this meeting.

Bill welcomed guests including.

- Elizabeth Martin Good News Clinics
- Bill Wittel Bulli/Virtual Dementia Tour
- Belinda Dickey President Sunshine Seniors Food Bank (Bill also reported that the Help the Hungry campaign this spring had raised \$14,000.00)
- Jeffrey Sulka Edward Jones Sponsor of the Cresswind Community Fund Golf Tournament which should raise \$30,000 this year.
- Wayne and Gerri Schrader and Nancy Evans who will perform later during the meeting.

Bill talked about the Cresswind Community Fund mission statement which is:

"to enhance the lives of adults primarily 55 and older through charitable, educational, health-related and cultural opportunities in the greater Gainesville area and Hall County."

He praised the efforts of the members of the Community Fund and the impact that those efforts have on the community where we all live – Hall County. To summarize what we do it is to Raise funds and Grant funds. Eighty percent of funds raised by the Community Fund come exclusively from Cresswind residents.

Bill talked about how far the Community Fund has come over the years in its fundraising efforts. He presented the new Spirit of Cresswind logo of hands raised. Bill said that the Cresswind Community Fund and Cresswind in general are recognized throughout Hall County for the work done by the Fund and other organizations and individuals in Cresswind.

Next on the agenda was a review of the organization of the Community Fund. The Board of Directors members and advisors were listed as were the committees. Two committees were highlighted:

 the Grant Committee chaired by Diane McIntee - which reviews and makes recommendations on grant requests. - The e-Team chaired by Wilton Rooks - which oversee the Neon Data Management System and the Community Fund Website.

In addition to the leadership the Community Fund relies on its membership which now totals 1,233 members.

#### Financial Report

The Financial Report was presented. The Fund is getting close to \$500,000.00 in donations received and \$430,000.00 grants made since the Fund was formed in 2016. Bill pointed out that rather than setting a budget, the Community Fund raises funds by running campaigns as needs are identified within the Hall County community. Bill used the 2021 year-end financial summary as an update, and reported May and June (to date) numbers. He said the Mid-Year Financial Report will be posted on the website in July.

At the end of May 2022, the Cresswind Community Fund had \$44,431.00 funds available.

June YTD Donations Less Grants/Expenses = approximately \$6,500.

Bill asked for a motion to approve the Financial Report. It was moved and seconded. The Financial report was approved

Wayne and Gerri Schrader and Nancy Evans were introduced for a musical interlude. The performance ended with appreciative applause from the audience. Bill thanked the three performers for their contribution to the meeting.

Bill presented the wide range of programs planned for 2022 including Help the Hungry, Help Me Please, Medical Worker & Clinic Support, Amazon Smile Program, Personal Care Program, Cresswind Projects, Mental Health First Aid, and Virtual Dementia Tour. Several of these programs were highlighted.

- Help the Hungary- Tons of food - Hundreds of People - Thousands of Meals. Bill introduced Belinda Dickey Who thanked the Community Fund for its support and spoke to the membership about the ongoing need for food support among the citizens of Hall County including seniors. She illustrated this need with stories of individuals who experience food insecurity.

- Good News Clinics Bill introduced Elizabeth Martin who spoke to the membership about the work of Good News Clinics. Ms. Martin said that 70% of their patient population is between 55 and 65 years of age. She reviewed the various medical services that they provide to the citizens of Hall County. She said that the low-income community in Hall County is increasing and that they have new applicants every day. They have raised \$5,500,000.00 toward the \$8,000,000.00 construction for their new facility. She thanked the membership for the support they have received from the Cresswind Community Fund. Bill mentioned that the Community Fund granted Good News Clinics \$10,000 toward the \$50,000 dental facility and equipment that they had planned.
- Mental Health First Aid United Way/Wisdom Project/Cresswind Community Fund. They are strategically planning for year two of this initiative.
- Help-Me-Please \$32,000.00 was raised in 2021 by projects completed by approximately 40 volunteers. Bud Baker was recognized as the manager of the Help Me Please volunteers.
- Virtual Dementia Tour -Bulli/INK/Cresswind Community Fund Bill Papciak introduced Bill Wittel who discussed the work of the Virtual Dementia Tour. The Course is six sessions intended to assist caregivers for patients with cognitive impairment due dementia and Alzheimer's disease. He discussed other programs that help patients with dementia and their caregivers.

Fourteen donated items were raffled by Jan Cieply and Janet McGee.

The meeting closed with the announcement of upcoming events:

- Spirit of Cresswind 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Golf Tournament Monday October 17, 2022 sponsored by Jeffrey Sulka of Edward Jones
- 3rd quarter Homecoming" Celebration and Meeting September 21st
- Personal Care Products Campaign 1<sup>st</sup> week of September

The meeting was adjourned at 4:38.


